WHAT ARE THE DIFFERENCES BETWEEN THE COURSE TYPES?

A LEVELS

A Levels adopt an academic style of learning, in which you study 3 subjects in depth over two years, much like your GCSEs. They are typically assessed by exams and can be a good choice if you know the route you would like to take, but also if you are undecided on your career path, as it leaves your options open.

VOCATIONAL & T LEVELS

These learning styles offer a more practical, hands-on approach and provide you with the skills needed to go out into employment. They are typically assessed through coursework and include work experiences and placements throughout your two years of study.

APPRENTICESHIPS

An apprenticeship is a work based learning style, which allows you to earn whilst you learn. 80% of time will be spent learning with an employer and 20% will be spent in college completing the theoretical side of an apprenticeship. If you do enjoy the more practical learning style, this could be for you.
