# Should I keep my child off school?

## Yes

### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

### **Ramadan**

This year, the holy month of Ramadan is due to start around 17th February. We are aware that the length of the fasting day will be 18 to 19 hours and that this may be difficult for some children. I know that you will have thought carefully about how or whether or not your child(ren) will be fasting, and the Academy will be respectful of your decision. If, however, a child shows signs of dehydration or exhaustion then they will be asked if they are fasting and advised to terminate the fast immediately by drinking some water. They will be reassured that in this situation Islamic rulings allow them to break their fast and make it up later. There is a prayer room available to all pupils as a quiet place to rest and pray during break and lunchtimes. Finally, I would like to take this opportunity to wish you Ramadan Mubarak and may every year find you in good health.

### **Year 9 Pathways Information Evening**

**Thursday 26th February 2026, 5pm – 6.30pm in the Drama Hall and Isaac Hall**

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are delighted to invite you to attend our **Year 9 Pathways Information Evening**. Year 9 students will soon be deciding which GCSEs and other qualifications to study next year. To support them, and you in this very important decision-making process, we would like to invite you and your child to our Information Evening on **Thursday 26th February 2026, 5pm – 6.30pm.**

At this event, you will be able to find out the answers to these questions:

- Which subjects are compulsory for students (the 'core' curriculum)?
- Which subjects are options? How many options are there?
- What academic and vocational courses are on offer?
- How do I submit my choices?
- **The Options Pathway Booklet**, which will guide you through your discussions and choices is available on our website under the 'Curriculum' section, where you can also watch videos from the Subject Leaders, explaining the courses we provide. We will also give a paper copy to Year 9 students at Pathways Evening.

On the evening, you will receive a welcome from Mrs Bowler and will then be taken through the Pathway choices by Mr Twohig, who will present our KS4 Curriculum. This will outline our guidance for ensuring that your child makes choices that will enable them to experience success in Year 10 and 11. Attendance is essential to discuss your child's options and to ensure your child is making the correct choices for their future.

**The Assembly for parents will take place at these slots, dependent on your child's tutor (students do not need to attend as they will have received this information in school and can stay in the subject fair in the Isaac Hall).**

On the evening, you will be given the Options Form and have the opportunity to attend a subject fair, where you can speak to staff about the different courses on offer. This form will allow you to choose the subjects that your child will study in Years 10 and 11. **The deadline for this form to be completed is Friday 6<sup>th</sup> March.**


During tutor time and assemblies in forthcoming weeks, your child will also have the opportunity to engage in activities to provide information, advice and guidance around the choice of education pathways available. A selected group of our Year 9 students will also meet with key members of staff for additional guidance in the run up to the submission of their final choices.
