








Pomodoro Technique



GCSE English at Braunton Academy



ALL students work towards TWO separate GCSEs:

English Language English Literature

No tiered entry (Higher or Foundation) – all students sit the same papers



GCSE ENGLISH LANGUAGE:



- √ 100% exam i.e. no coursework
- Two terminal exams testing students' reading and writing ability
- All texts in the examination will be unseen
- √ SPaG (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar) = 20%





GCSE ENGLISH LANGUAGE:

Paper 1: Explorations in Creative Reading and Writing

1 hour 45 minutes; 50% of the GCSE



Paper 2: Writers' Viewpoints and Perspectives

1 hour 45 minutes; 50% of the GCSE



Spoken Language Endorsement:

- √ internally assessed
- √ does NOT contribute to the overall grade



GCSE ENGLISH LITERATURE:



- √ 100% exam i.e. no coursework
- Two terminal exams testing students' understanding of texts they have studied across two years
- ✓ Both exams are 'closed book' students cannot take their texts into the exam

Paper 1: Shakespeare (Macbeth) and the 19th Century

Novel (A Christmas Carol)

1 hour 45 minutes; 40% of the GCSE

Paper 2: Modern Texts (An Inspector Calls) and Poetry*

2 hours 15 minutes; 60% of the GCSE
















GCSE Maths

Edexcel 9-1

$$x = \frac{-b \pm \sqrt{b^2 - 4ac}}{2a}$$

The GCSE consists of 3 papers.

Paper 1: non-calculator paper.

Papers 2 and 3 : calculator papers.

Each paper is marked out of 80 and is $1 \frac{1}{2}$ hours long.



• Get times tables locked in – this is crucial! Making sure the basics are in place is paramount to achieving the grades needed. No matter what your ability is, practice numeracy questions! Every year this is mentioned in the examiners report as a weakness nationally, particularly in the higher sets.





Science at KS4 AQA Trilogy





Questions on practical work will make up15% of each of the exams








Grading is sequential and based on overall marks scored, there are no separate grades for the different disciplines the grades awarded are for Science.

Higher tier 4-4 to 9-9/those failing to reach level required for 4-3 will score U Foundation 1-1 to 5:5/ those failing to reach 1:1 will score U


